PhD Workshop A child's play? Multilingualism in infancy and childhood

Abstract

Due to very different reasons many children grow up with more than one language. Some children are exposed to multilingual input right from birth, whereas others are confronted with more than one language in (early) childhood. The possible interaction of different linguistic, social, and contextual conditions opens up new perspectives on the study of multilingualism in infancy and childhood.

This workshop will focus on the question of how children adapt to input in more than one language. In their presentations, Krista Byers-Heinlein addresses "Studying multilingualism in infancy" and Anat Stavans approaches "Multilingual input: a discursive negotiation". Starting from different methodological approaches, they both present ongoing research on the role of input in successful development in more than one language.




About the guest speakers

Krista Byers-Heinlein is Assistant Professor at Concordia University, Montreal, Canada. She investigates infant language development with primarily behavioral methods and is particularly interested in infants growing up in bilingual environments and the mechanisms that they use to acquire two languages simultaneously. A related line of work investigates bilingual parenting, and how the language strategies used by bilingual families influence children's language learning.

Anat Stavans is Senior Researcher at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Her research is focused on language skills and emergent literacy in multilingual children. She is interested in how family language policy influence on literacy enhancement and development. Additionally, she has also investigated language production, especially code-switching and code-mixing, in trilingual children.
